Tournament Rules and Regulations

General:

1. Registration – Boat captains may register at the HICA office by 5:00 PM on the Friday before the scheduled tournament, August 2, 2009 (do not mail). The Hawaii Island Contractor's Association office is located at 494 C Kalanikoa Street, Hilo, HI 96720. Office phone number is 935-1316.
2. Refunds – 'Hardship' refunds up to tournament start time.
3. Each boat shall have a minimum of two (2) people on board, including the Captain. All boats entering the tournament must be paid. Additional crew members may be added on the day of the Tournament but must sign the Indemnity Form before leaving the dock. You must inform Tournament Control if you have added members or if a previously signed up member is not on board.
4. All boats must be launched from and return to the Wailoa River Basin.
5. All boats entered must contact Tournament Control by telephone (959-4038) by 7:00 AM of the tournament day if they are **not** going to participate. Failure to do so will result in the forfeiture of the boat's entry fee and jackpot. Contact should also be made if leaving late.
6. Tournament weigh-in station is at Suisan.
7. All boats will be subject to a complete check at the Wailoa Boat Ramp or other designated area. Inspection will include boat compliance to Coast Guard regulations, radio, fish-boxes and compartments. Boxes may be checked by 'rodding'.
8. All boats **must** check in with, and be acknowledged by Tournament Control, channel 23 CB, channel 68 VHF, (after boat inspection) prior to leaving and upon returning to the break-wall.
9. All boats **must** have a CB radio that is acceptable to Tournament Control. Boats with defective radios shall be suspended until repairs are acceptable. Tournament Control has the authority to call back any boat entered in the tournament. All boats must check out with Tournament Control when returning. Make sure that your radio transmission is acknowledged. Back up channel for CB is channel 21. Cellular phones and VHF radios are optional. VHF is highly recommended. The US Coast Guard does not monitor CB radio, making VHF the only means of communicating with them in the case of an emergency. Tournament Control will monitor VHF on channel 68, FCC rules and regulations should be observed at all times.
10. All boats must be in full compliance with Coast Guard regulations.
11. Tournament Control will NOT arrange for sale of any fish.
12. If your fish is not going to be sold by Suisan, please have your fish picked up at the boat ramp.
13. The registered captain shall be the name that appears on the original registration form. A captain shall be registered on (1) one boat only.

Fishing Time

1. Start time for all tournaments shall be 5:30 AM. No tournament boat shall leave the break-wall before this start time.
2. Stop fishing shall be at 3:30 PM for all tournaments. A five-minute radio silence shall precede stop fishing time. All boats must be inside the break-wall 30 minutes after stop fishing, unless they are still fighting a fish past stop fishing time. Exceptions may be made only in cases of extended fighting time or of landed fish that are too large to pull onboard safely. The Tournament Committee, in consultation with Tournament Control, may add fighting time to extend the deadline by which the boat must be within the break-wall. In all cases, all boats absolutely must be in the break-wall by 6:00 PM. In the event that a captain decides to continue to fight a fish after the 6:00 PM deadline; it shall be without the Tournament Committee sanction.
3. The Marine forecast at 6:00 PM on the day prior to the tournament will determine if tournament may be cancelled due to 'Small-Craft Advisory'. If 'Caution is Advised', the cancellation will be up to the Tournament Committee. Tournament will be postponed if a Small Craft Advisory is posted between Saturday evening and start fishing on Sunday morning. Should a Small Craft Advisory be posted between start fishing and 10:30 am, there will be Tournament shutdown and postponed. All fish landed or hooked up prior to that time will be carried over. Should a Small Craft Advisory be posted after 10:30 am the Tournament will be shut down and the results will stand. The final decision to go out is left up to the judgment of the captain. Boat Captains may also verify the weather report by calling the NOAA office at 935-5055.

Round-Up

1. There will be (3) round-ups on tournament day. Round-up times will be conducted at 10:00 AM, 2:00 PM and 3:30 PM. Tournament Control will call each boat. When your boat is called please give the following information:
 - A. Location you are fishing in.
 - B. Number of species of all flag fish boated for the day.
2. In the event that Tournament Control cannot contact a boat for round up, it shall be the captain's responsibility to contact Control within thirty (30) minutes of the round-up time.
3. If a boat is unable to make contact with anyone at the 10:00 AM round-up, the boat must make contact or be in the break-wall by 12:00 PM and make contact with the Suisan Base or all catch for the day will be disqualified.
4. If a boat is unable to make contact with anyone at the 2:00 PM round up, the boat must be in the break-wall by 3:30 PM and make contact with Suisan Base or all catch for the day will be disqualified.
5. If a boat cannot be contacted for the final round up of the day, the captain must contact Suisan Base by 4:00 PM, or all catch for the day will be disqualified.
6. The Tournament Committee and Weight Master will enforce the round-up rules.

Hook-Ups

1. All fish must be 'hooked-up' with the boat under it's own power and in motion.
2. All 'hook-ups' and area fishing in must be called in immediately to Tournament Control. (Use grid map for location you are in).
3. When catch is boated, Tournament Control must be notified of species, estimated weight of catch, and area caught. However, if fish is boated in an area where radio contact cannot be made to Tournament Control, a

4. Fish need not be fought from a gimbal. Fish may be fought from the rod holder. The angler may grab and pull the area of line between the reel and the guide closest to the reel to compensate for the loss of pumping action created by using a gimbal or fighting chair.

Weigh-In

1. Weigh-in starts at 12:30 PM Suisan control shall notify boats when to pull up to the scales. All fish caught must be weighed on the tournament scales on the day of the catch.
2. Fish of equal weight are considered a tie. The first to be officially weighed will be listed in the scoreboard as whatever place it would normally hold. The second fish and any other following of the same weight will be listed in the next place progressively downward. The prize money for all fish of equal weight will be added together and then divided equally or among tied contestants.
3. Any protest may be filed verbally, or in writing, by the captain of the boat entered in the tournament, to the Tournament Committee on the day of the tournament. The Protest Committee (Tournament Committee, and Weight Master) will make a ruling within 24 hours.

Awards

1. Flag fish categories are Marlin, Ahi, Mahi-mahi, and Ono. All flag fish must meet minimum weights. Minimum weights shall be Marlin (blue or black) – 100 pounds (stripe, spear – 25 pounds), Ahi – 25 pounds, Ono – 10 pounds, Mahi-mahi – 10 pounds.
2. The Awards Committee shall determine the type, value, and quantity of all prizes and awards.
3. There will be no transfer of points.

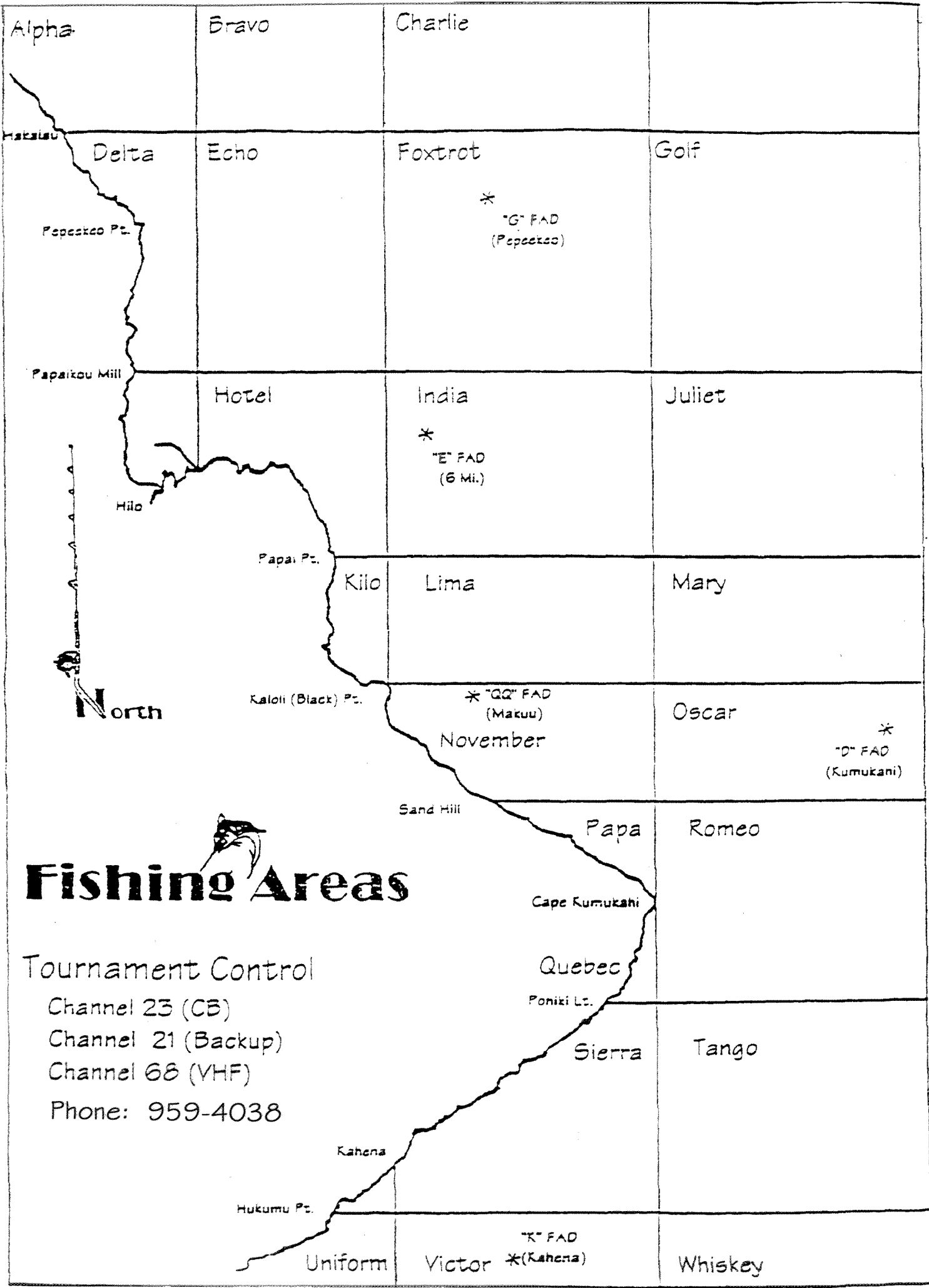
Tackle and Methods

1. All tackle; including leader, rod, reel, hooks, lures, and other equipment such as gaffs and methods shall comply with tournament rules.
2. Exceptions to IGFA rules.
 - A. Leaders and lures may be re-used or re-rigged.
 - B. There is no maximum breaking strength limit on main lines.
 - C. Fish may be fought from the rod holder.
 - D. 'Kagi' (killer gaff) may be used.
 - E. Double hooks may used only to catch aku or kawakawa.
3. Prohibited methods.
 - A. Green stick.
 - B. Drop stone (palu ahi).
 - C. Electric reels.
 - D. Shooting of fish.

Reasons for Disqualification

1. Mutilated fish. By shark, boat propeller, etc.

2. Disregarding Tournament Control.
3. Uninspected vessel.
4. Caught fish is not reported to Tournament Control in a timely manner.
5. Non-member on board except as permitted by Tournament Committee.
6. Abusive or unsportsmanlike behavior.
7. Unable to contact boat during 10:00 AM round up and boat is not in the break-wall by 12:00 PM.
8. Unable to contact boat during 2:30 PM round-up and boat is not in the break-wall by 3:30 PM
9. Unable to contact boat during last round up and boat is not in the break-wall within 30 minutes.

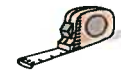
